KEY 1/2

- 1. The World Health Organization defines health as a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being.
- 2. Public health involves **preventing** disease, **prolonging** life and **promoting** health through society.
- 3. Doctor = immediate health problem, treating individual. Public health approach is holistic how, why, how to prevent.

Example of car acident

- → vision
- → driving skills, attitude
- → substance abuse (law enforcement)
- community expectations
- → support for recovery/prevention

- road safety
- car safety
- economic factors (linked to job, education)
- access to health services



KEY 2/2

- 4. Health is determined by a complex interaction between many different factors such as individual characteristics, lifestyle and behaviors and also the physical, social and economic environments, the social determinants of health.
