- 1) Mingling: assign a number to each student. They ask their question to as many students as they can. They should be ready to report what they have found out.
- 2) Debriefing in groups of 4, then with the whole class. Link with video (what was it about ?)
- 3) Sentence completion: vocab from HWK quiz
- 4) Brainstorm reasons why young people drink (in groups)
- 5) Now, each group ranks the reasons shown on this slide
- 6) Check your answers with the 2017 stats (England). Does it match your expectations?
- 7) What policies are needed? Brainstorming with your partner, then read **What needs to** happen (extract from : Alcohol and public health) and add to your list.
- 8) Compare with your list, anything in common?
- 9) How effective are they? Hand out the cards. One students keeps them all and reads them one by one. The group decides how they will rank them (efficacy). They select their top 3 and prepare to defend their choices.
- 10) Debriefing
- 11) Pre-reading quiz: High or low impact?
- 12) Reading Evaluating alcohol policy options (extract from Alcohol in Europe): any surprises?
- 13) Question—forming: Wh word + AUX + Subj+verb+ rest of question
- 14) Language work: subordinate conjunctions
- 15) If time: Ask the right Q from class 6 (AL has already done it)
- 16) Talking about their projects for oral presentations
