➡ The word order for yes/no questions with the verb to be in a simple tense is:

Verb + Subject + Complement <u>ex</u>: Are we late?

→ The word order for yes/no questions in tenses requiring an auxiliary is:

Auxiliary + Subject + Verb + Complement <u>ex</u>: Has she called her mother?
